## Your Transfer to NCAFP New Physician Membership

Congratulations on completing residency! Like your medical practice, your NCAFP membership is moving into the next phase.

The good news — you don't need to do anything. The American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) automatically transfers your "Resident" status to "Active" status once you finish residency. We at the NCAFP approve the transferal and certify your new status. But even though you don't actively transfer your membership, you should still know everything coming your way, including benefits and responsibilities.

## **BENEFITS**

As an Active member, you now:

- Have the ability to vote on organizational matters, including the NCAFP Board of Directors
- Have the opportunity to hold leadership offices in the NCAFP, AAFP, or both
- Have access to all NCAFP CME opportunities and the benefit of NCAFP staff reporting your earned CME hours for you
- Receive every state and national opportunity for networking and precepting
- Have the ability to participate in NCAFP advocacy efforts
- And much more!

## RESPONSIBILITIES

As an Active member, you now:

- Must complete 150 hours of CME every three years (split between 75 hours of prescribed credit and 75 hours of elective credit)
- Must pay Active Membership Annual Dues your first year is at a discounted rate of \$410! This amount is the discounted rate for new physicians. After 18 months, your dues will increase to the full Active amount of \$810 per year (\$470 in national dues and \$350 in state dues).
